





Our Moosehaven residents use electric tricycles to move freely around the Moosehaven Campus from their residence to the Beauty or Barber Shop or perhaps to a doctor's appointment or Bingo.

And while our residents are zooming around Campus with the wind blowing through their hair, they are receiving many of the benefits of adult biking which revolves around the great coordination of the various muscles during the process of pedaling- the arms and legs coordinating to mount and dismount from the tricycle-the hand and eye coordination to steer and direct-all in conjunction and in perfect unison with the mental faculties of the adult rider.

Adult tricycle riding can help refine and reduce certain mental conditions such as anxiety, depression, and stress common with some elderly riders. Adults can achieve these goals by regularly making use of their tricycles and enjoying the comfort and peace associated with biking adult tricycles.

Seeking High Schoolers: Moose Youth Awareness Program Speakers' Bureau Offers College Scholarships; Encourages Healthy Choices

While some high school students are just getting back into school routines, others have their eyes on what's to come. These are the ideal students for the Moose Youth Awareness Program, which gives participants an opportunity to compete for \$30,000 in college scholarship money. Five winners, selected by their peers, receive scholarships (1st place - \$12,000; 2nd place - \$8,000; 3rd place - \$5,000; 4th place - \$3,000; and 5th place - \$2,000). In addition, the Wisconsin Moose Association Youth Awareness Program will offer scholarships for the top two as well as runners up based on program participation.

High school students who are interested in public speaking and educating young children on a number of positive lifestyle topics ranging from bullying to drugs/alcohol are encouraged to participate in the program, sponsored by the more than one million men and women of the Moose organization. (note: students need not be affiliated with the loyal order of the moose or women of the moose to be eligible)

In order to participate, students must attend a State Youth Awareness Congress 1-hour information session to gain an understanding of how the program works. During this session, students will identify an issue they want to address - some base it on direct experiences, such as bullying or child abuse; others see a problem they want to "fix." All topics must promote healthy choices in young children ages 4-9. Students then create their own "Moose Kids Talks" presentations to reach these audiences. Over the next several months, program participants identify their own speaking opportunities in various clubs and organizations and must make three or more presentations by February 2019. At the end of February, written reports submitted by those students who have completed at least three "Moose Kids Talks" are judged by a peer group to determine who will represent the state at the annual International Youth Awareness Congress will be held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (at no cost to students or parents).
