Governor Message . . .

Congratulations to the members of Muskego Lodge 1057 for being one of only six lodges in Wisconsin to achieve the Premier Lodge Award for the 2018-2019 campaign year! A big thanks to last year's Lodge officers for their hard work and leadership. Let's all work together during the Create Our Future campaign to make it two years in row!

The Loyal Order of Moose has been around for over 130 years but to be sustainable we need to continually improve our organization, and that is exactly what we are doing. During the recently completed Moose International Convention in Las Vegas, the delegates voted overwhelming to make all lodges throughout the fraternity smoke-free effective January 2020, a long overdue move to make all of our lodge homes a place where all members can spend time with their families in a healthy environment. At the upcoming Wisconsin Moose Association convention in September, there will be an official vote to have the chapters and co-workers become members of the association. In November there will be a fraternity-wide Town Hall meeting in Orlando to discuss possible future implementation of One Moose, a concept which would restructure our organization to a gender-neutral membership, where men and women have an equal voice in management and leadership within our lodges. It is certainly an exciting time to be a Moose member and be a part of this evolution.

In July, the House Committee decided to create the position of **Social Quarters Manager** in an effort to improve the lodge experience for members. The Social Quarters Manager duties will include scheduling the bartending staff, assisting with coordinating kitchen operations, and being responsible for purchasing food, alcohol and other supplies. The Social Quarters Manager can be male or female and would preferably be a member of the Moose (although, that is not required). I was recently contacted by a lodge member who expressed his displeasure that there were no chicken wings on one of the Wednesday evenings in July. 

WISCONSIN STATE MOOSE HORSESHOE TOURNAMENT






