Governor Message . . .

And just like that, the last two months of 2019 are upon us! I look back in amazement at the recent accomplishments of our Muskego Moose Lodge (winning the Premier Lodge Award), the Wisconsin Moose Association (voting for a Joint Association, where men and women have an equal voice and standing), and the overall Moose organization (decision to go smoke-free in all lodges) and am so excited at what lies ahead for us!

Since 1913, the men and women of the Moose have always worked well together to accomplish our core missions, but management and decision making were not shared functions. I am delighted to report that true equality is coming at all levels of the Moose! As mentioned above, the Wisconsin Moose is now a Joint Association, meaning that women Moose members can now hold District and State officer positions. Additionally, the members of the Muskego Lodge 1057 and Chapter 1617 recently voted to implement a Joint House Committee, meaning that soon management and decision making related to the operations of our Lodge will be a joint effort by the Lodge and Chapter Boards of Officers. Finally, as mentioned in the previous newsletter, this month representatives from all levels of the Moose organization will meet in Orlando, Florida for the One Moose Town Hall to discuss the idea of establishing a single membership model that will provide enhanced opportunities for all members of the Fraternity.

To some Moose members, these changes toward true equality may appear to be a bit scary but I believe it is critical for the future health and sustainability of not just our lodge, but the entire Moose organization. I hope everyone embraces these changes and commits to helping make our Lodge a better place.

In September, the House Committee hired Dave Skrobis to the position of Social Quarters Manager. Dave, who has been a long-time member and is a Past Governor of the Lodge, will be responsible for managing operations, scheduling the bartending staff, assisting with coordinating kitchen operations, and purchasing food, alcohol and other supplies. A big thanks to Dave for stepping up to help our lodge!

The Muskego Lodge has chartered a bus for the December 7th Mooseheart Tree Lighting Program. This promises to be a very special day and, for those that have never been to Mooseheart before, this will be a life-changing event. If interested, please put your name on the Tree Lighting Sign-up Sheet located on the notice board across from the bar. As you read through the newsletter, you will notice that there are many other fun activities going on at the Lodge in November and December. We invite all members to come down to the Lodge with your family to enjoy some fun and fellowship. Remember, this is your Lodge!



- Lodge must remit Endowment Fund contributions to Moose Charities in at least 10 months during the year.

Our Moosehaven residents use electric tricycles to move freely around the Moosehaven Campus from their residence to the Beauty or Barber Shop or perhaps to a doctor's appointment or Bingo.

And while our residents are zooming around Campus with the wind blowing through their hair, they are receiving many of the benefits of adult biking which revolves around the great coordination of the various muscles during the process of pedaling- the arms and legs coordinating to mount and dismount from the tricycle-the hand and eye coordination to steer and direct-all in conjunction and in perfect unison with the mental faculties of the adult rider.
