I'm proud of several individuals in our lodge that stepped forward to help Kenosha out in the name of our lodge. First, I want to recognize Dave Skrobis for recognizing Kenosha's plight and suggesting we help them out. Then, Kenny Engels for putting together several Nesco's of cooked pulled pork and Tom Kronenburg for organizing with the Kenosha lodge so they can receive and distribute our donation saving them the expense of purchasing the food themselves. Hopefully everyone has been able to remain healthy. Dealing with COVID 19 has not come without issues in running our lodge. Both the men and women are working hard to work out the many issues. Resolving all these issues doesn't come without a few bumps in the road. I ask that everyone please be patient and understanding while we work things out.

We are still searching for a permanent Administrator. Tom Kronenburg has done a great job as interim administrator. The administrator position is not an easy job. We have increased our number of volunteer bartenders. We are still working on finding more volunteers to work in the kitchen. Hopefully, we will have a new kitchen manager soon. We have now filled the vacant board position of treasurer. Clyde Brophy is our treasurer. We are still searching for someone to fill the prelate position. We continue to make improvements at our lodge. We recently replaced the failed rooftop heating and cooling unit serving the Social Quarters. We're close to hiring a paving contractor to improve our parking lot. Expansion of the outdoor deck is still in planning. We're still working on other improvements. I'm always interested in hearing from our members of ideas to improve our lodge. So, if anyone has an idea, I want to hear it! Please do not hesitate to come see me.

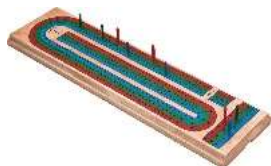

As I stated earlier, the season of increased activity is coming, here is a list of upcoming events;

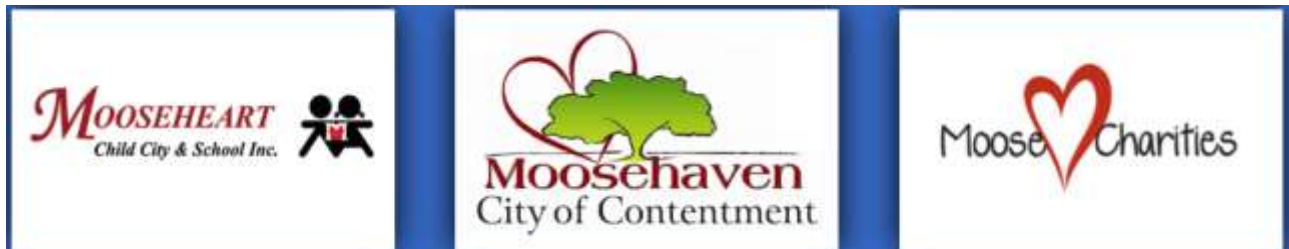

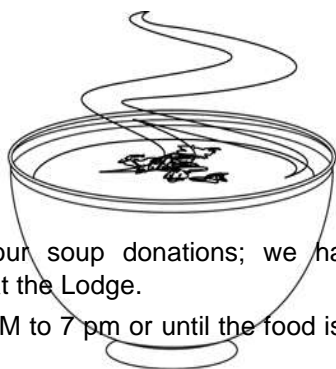
