



On Sunday, September 13th, at the Annual State Conference, Shirley received her Green Cap honor!

"What is that?" you may be asking?

The Green Cap is an honor, not a degree, for the WOTM (Women of the Moose). Junior Graduate Regents (JGR) were first invested with the Green Cap in 1950.
