### *Elections of Officers is just around the corner*

Each year Lodges are required to hold an election of officers for the new Moose Year. (Moose Fiscal Year is May 1 – April 30). During the month of February, a Nominating Committee will be appointed by Gov. Kevin Pope to determine the slate of officers for the 2021-2022 year. Nominations will be accepted for the offices of Governor, Junior Governor, Prelate, Treasurer and 3-Year Trustee. Some of the duties of these offices are:

**GOVERNOR:** Appoints committee chairmen, nonelected positions, presides over regular and House committee meetings, signs checks and reports in general, and is the leader of his Lodge.

**JUNIOR GOVERNOR:** Serves as acting governor when necessary, attends all meetings, assist the governor in preserving order and decorum in the Lodge and visits members who are ill.

**PRELATE:** Serves ON the House committee, attends all Lodge and officer's meetings and presides at meeting in the absence of the governor and junior governor.

**TREASURER:** Secures duplicate deposit slips made for all Lodge bank accounts, signs all properly authorized checks and shall assist Administrator when necessary.

**3-YEAR TRUSTEE:** Takes inventory of Lodge merchandise for resale, examines and approves all bills for payment, verifies books and safeguards equipment and assets of the Lodge and attends all meetings.

**NOW** is the time for **YOU** – the member – to step forward and get involved with the many things happening at **YOUR** Lodge. The Lodge is looking for – and needs – members with a sense of pride, commitment and time to serve.

One of the most rewarding tasks in the world is volunteering some time to an organization or cause. The sense of satisfaction in doing something for others is the greatest feeling in the world! Explore those feelings! You'll be glad you did!

Anyone interested in serving in one of these offices may submit his name to Governor Kevin Pope, any Lodge officer or any member of the Nominating Committee.

I did bartend about 6-7 years ago, where most of you remember me from. I am also best friends with Tom Kronenburg's daughter, Melissa.
