Elections of Board of Directors is just around the corner

Each year Lodges are required to hold an election of Board of Directors for the new Moose Year. (Moose Fiscal Year is May 1 – April 30). During the month of February, a Nominating Committee will be appointed by President Kevin Pope to determine the slate of Board of Directors for the 2022-2023 year. Nominations will be accepted for the offices of President, Vice President, Chaplin, Treasurer and 3-Year Trustee. Some of the duties of these offices are:

PRESIDENT: Appoints committee chairmen, non-elected positions, presides over the Board of Directors meeting and Membership meetings, signs checks and reports in general, and is the leader of his Lodge.

VICE PRESIDENT: Serves as acting President, when necessary, attends all meetings, assist the President in preserving order and decorum in the Lodge and visits members who are ill.

CHAPLIN: Serves on the Financial Review committee, attends all Lodge and Board of Directors meetings and presides at meeting in the absence of the President and Vice President

TREASURER: Secures duplicate deposit slips made for all Lodge bank accounts, signs all properly authorized checks and shall assist Administrator when necessary.

3-YEAR TRUSTEE: Takes inventory of Lodge merchandise for resale, examines, and approves all bills for payment, verifies books and safeguards equipment and assets of the Lodge and attends all meetings.

NOW is the time for YOU – the member – to step forward and get involved with the many things happening at YOUR Lodge. The Lodge is looking for – and needs – members with a sense of pride, commitment, and time to serve. One of the most rewarding tasks in the world is volunteering some time to an organization or cause. The sense of satisfaction in doing something for others is the greatest feeling in the world! Explore those feelings! You'll be glad you did!

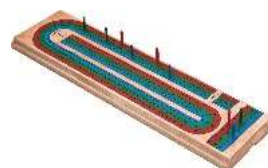

Nominations & Election of Officers for the Women of the Moose

The Chapter year runs from May 1st to April 30th.

We start the Election of Officer's process in January, where we ask our members to submit their names for consideration for the following offices:

Senior Regent

She shall preside at all Chapter meetings, preserve order, apply, and enforce all laws of the Women of the Moose and appoint certain officers, Chairmen of Chapter Committees, and the various special committees of the Chapter, as required by the Women of the Moose General Laws. She shall be a member of most other Chapter committees and oversee the proper operation of the Chapter. She, or the Secretary, shall sign all checks drawn by the Treasurer.

Secretary

She shall properly document the meetings of the Chapter via minutes of all meetings and preserve same as required. She shall receive all duplicate deposit slips of the Chapter, and with the Senior Regent and Treasurer, be custodian of all securities and perform all other duties required of her by the General Laws of the Women of the Moose. She, or the Senior Regent, shall sign all checks drawn by the Treasurer.

In the absence of the Senior Regent and Junior Past Regent, she presides over meetings of the Chapter.

Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for the proper collection and deposit of all Chapter funds as well as the expenditure of any funds. It is her responsibility to ensure that all membership applications and information is handled in the required manner as established by the International Office of the Women of the Moose.

Each quarter, she shall make the computer data and supporting financial information available to the Financial Review Committee for the purpose of auditing the proper documentation of all receipts and expenditures.

In the absence of the Senior Regent, Junior Past Regent and Secretary she presides over meetings of the Chapter.

Then the Nominating Committee will meet two (2) times to discuss the candidates and review their records.

At the February 17th meeting, the Slate of Officers will be announced, and the Election of Officers will take place on March 17th from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Recognized at January meeting

The Jan 20th meeting will be in honor of Golden Gavel Chair Rachel Oemig-Klein and her committee.

Each committee is assigned a special project by International Headquarters and our committee is proud to be able to provide funds to assist our students with Physical and Occupational Therapy. A number of our children at Mooseheart require short and long-term treatment in the areas of Physical and Occupational Therapy. Whether children arrive at Mooseheart requiring a continuation of services, receive a referral by our Pediatrician or are recovering from an injury, these medical treatments are often not covered by the state's children's health care plan or, a provider within the plan is too far away from Mooseheart. To ensure that our kids receive quality medical care our support in this area is truly important!

The committee's fund raiser will be the Wing Wednesday's. From the proceeds the committee will be able to make a generous donation to support this important need, as well as to the WOTM Scholarship & Maintenance Fund

Mooseheart/Moosehaven Committee

Honored at February meeting

The Feb 17th Chapter meeting is in honor of the Mooseheart/Moosehaven Chair Pam Thrall and her committee. The annual pharmacy budget for our Moosehaven resident's averages \$300,000 per year, over and above the amounts covered by Medicare and private insurance. The cost of prescription drugs and over the counter medications and supplies necessary to our resident's good health continues to escalate at an alarming rate. The Women of the Moose have pledged to help offset this expense.

The Committee's fundraising project is still in the planning stages. The Mooseheart/Moosehaven Committee is extremely pleased to be able to donate funds towards the annual Moosehaven budget and once again, assist our Moosehaven Residents and the WOTM Scholarship & Maintenance Fund.

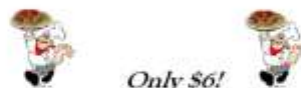
