President Message ...

Hi Everyone!

This will be my last newsletter message as President of our lodge. Come May 1 this year, we will have a new lodge president. It's been a challenging two years as the last Governor and First President of our lodge. In April, elections will be held should there be two or more members running for a lodge board position. In my last 5 years on the board, I've never seen any board position having more than one candidate. With becoming One Moose, hopefully that will change. Notices for members wishing to run for a board position will be posted in the next week or two. I encourage anyone having the slightest interest in running for a position, to do so. We need your help!

I'd like to remind everyone our lodge is maintained and operated by mostly volunteers. There currently are only two paid positions in our lodge. Our cleaning help cleans the lodge in the morning every day we are open. I'm sure everyone would agree that our cleaning help does a magnificent job keeping our lodge clean. Our Social Quarters Manager is the other paid position. Social Quarters manager is a difficult job with modest pay. All the rest of lodge operations from working the kitchen, bartending, working on the board and helping raise funds for the lodge are volunteers. Without these volunteers, our lodge would not survive.

I would like to especially recognize two volunteers in our lodge that without their help, I feel we would not survive. Tom Kronenburg our Administrator and Doug (alphabet) Szymuszkiewicz our Kitchen Manager. If you are wondering how to pronounce Doug's last name, come see me. I've become an expert at its pronunciation!

Tom Kronenburg has been our administrator ever since I became lodge Governor. This is a fulltime job and probably the most difficult job in our lodge. The Administrator is normally a paid position. However, Tom has not received any payment for his services other than reimbursements for expenses. Doug has been our Kitchen manager as long as I've been our lodge president. Doug has recently completed his certification as Kitchen Manager and is now on record with the city, state and internationally as our official kitchen manager! Apparently, Doug went well above the minimum necessary by passing the more difficult international exam. Doug has been responsible for keeping our kitchen stocked with food and supplies along with paper products for the Social Quarters. The Kitchen Manager is normally a paid position. However, Doug too has not received any payment for his services other than reimbursements for expenses. Both Tom and Doug have been working in the kitchen preparing fish fry's and Taco Night. They probably cover 80% or more of our needed kitchen help hours each week.

We need more members like Tom and Doug to step up and help run this lodge. Seems to me that too many members treat this lodge like it is a country club where all they have to do is pay their dues and enjoy the benefits of membership. While this is all that is required, it is not all that is expected of a member. If everyone were to help take care of just one thing in our lodge, we wouldn't have volunteer burnout. Volunteer burnout is probably the major reason why we lose volunteers. Please help us keep our volunteers by volunteering yourself.

Last, I'd like to introduce our new lodge Chaplin to the membership. Edward Riebe is our new Chaplin as Dave Skrobis is stepping down. I want to thank Dave Skrobis for his service this year and all past years. Edward is also the Chaplin for the salvation Army. Welcome Edward!

It's been an honor serving as our lodge Governor and President. Until we meet in the lodge, See ya!



As I pass the gavel to the new Senior Regent, I wish you all the best. I will be here to help in any way I can. I am sure you will do a great job.




