## Dandilion Daze

In 1987, leaders from some of Muskego's community service groups came together to present the citizens of Muskego with a weekend long family-orientated community event.

That was over 30 years ago!

The first festival was held on empty grounds where Pick and Save stands today. As the festival grew, there was a need for more space and the celebration moved to the grounds next to City Hall.

Today, that family-orientated community event has blossomed into one of the largest free multi day festivals in southeast Wisconsin featuring music for all ages, top bands from the area, variety of food, a carnival, a corn-hole tournament, a 5K Corndog race/walk and a parade. Traditionally held the fourth weekend in August, it has often been referred to as the "official end of summer".

This is the only festival in the area which has eight collaborating community service groups that meet all year long to plan, present and staff this event. The groups are:

- Muskego Woman's Club
- **Muskego Moose Lodge**
- VFW#8171
- Muskego Iceetronauts Snowmobile Club
- Muskego Athletic Association
- Muskego Lions Club
- Muskego Area Chamber of Commerce
- Little Muskego Lakes Association

Any excess net funds from the event are shared among the groups. Each group uses the funds to provide community enhancement programs in support of education, child services, city beautification, community events, patriotism as well as their own mission.

Our own Muskego Moose has overseen the task of parking cars during the festival weekend. Kevin Pope is the lodge representative and coordinates volunteers to cover all the shifts. As a Muskego Moose member, consider volunteering as little as an hour or two or more to support this epic community event and fundraiser for the eight groups! ## Join us celebrating new Muskego Chapter Collegian, Shirley Knight! What is the *College of Regents Degree*?

Let's take a step back and review what the College of Regents is first.

The College of Regents degree is one of three degrees a co-worker (woman of the Moose) can earn and is the highest to achieve. To earn this coveted degree, the following must happen: (*Refer to WOTM General Laws May 2021, starting at Section 97, Eligibility for the Golden Gavel; Section 98, Golden Gavel; and Section 99, College of Regents*)

This is from Section 99, Eligibility for College of Regents:

- Eligibility for College of Regents shall be limited to a member who has met the qualifications for the degree during her term of office as Senior Regent and during her term of office as Junior Past Regent. If she qualified for the Golden Gavel, she has met one-half (1/2) of the requirements for the College of Regents Degree.
  - During her year as Junior Past Regent she shall:
    - 1. Be installed as Junior Past Regent on or before July 31 and shall serve in the same capacity through April 30.
    - 2. Sponsor and enroll two (2) or more new or re-enrolled members into the Chapter between May 1 and April 30.
    - 3. Hold a Golden Gavel Celebration Meeting.
    - 4. Serve as Chairman of the Golden Gavel Committee, which shall hold a fundraising project to cover expenses of the committee which may include: a recommended thirty dollars (\$30.00) or more donation for the special project(s) of the Golden Gavel Committee that shall benefit Mooseheart/ Moosehaven; a recommended twenty dollars (\$20.00) or more donation to the Women of the 69 General Laws 2021:Layout 2 3/19/2021 11:51 AM Page 69 Moose Scholarship and Maintenance Fund; to help defray expenses of the celebration meeting; and help maintain the General Fund of the chapter.
    - 5. Attend the Annual Women of the Moose Training Session. 6. Attend Board of Officer's meetings, and monthly Chapter meetings as required under Section 43.

Whew! As you can tell it is not a small feat and is achieved by the success of the Chapter as a whole. A co-worker who has earned her College of Regents Degree is known as a Collegian. A Collegian should continue to support her Chapter for it to be successful; should continue to be a source of knowledge and experience for her fellow co-workers; should be an example of how to be a Moose and Moose proud!

### Moosehaven, the City of Contentment


