

The following requirements must be met in order to be eligible for the "Heart of the Community Scholarship"

The applicant must:

TW Be a student in the high school graduating Class of 2024

Have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a paid-up member of the Moose (Applicant is NOT required to reside in the same household)

Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (C+) or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent **verified by a copy of student's transcript.** 

(Completing the above criteria qualifies for a chance for a \$1,000 scholarship)

If the applicant completes one or more of the optional criteria below. He/she will qualify for a chance for a \$5,000 scholarship:

**In-School/Extra-Curricular activities** (i.e. school sports teams, band, chess club, theater, etc)

• To satisfy this requirement a school official must verify this by completing their section of the application.

**Out-of-School activities** (i.e. employment scouting programs, music lessons, non-school related sports)

To satisfy this requirement **Moose International must receive a letter** or email from the student's supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc) no later than June 30, 2023. The letter should include: 1) The name, title, email, and phone number of the supervising adult; 2) Details of the student's participation 3) The type of activities they engaged in; and 4) The dates/date range of their participation.



#### WHY DO WE ASK YOU TO SHOW YOUR MEMBERSHIP CARD?



I have walked into many, many Moose lodges during my years as a member. Every time, I have been proud to reach into my wallet as I entered, to fulfill the requirement of displaying my Moose membership card.

Even though showing a Moose membership card every time, a member enters a lodge or makes a purchase says many positive things about a person, I know that this requirement has been a big point of irritation among many Moose "Fifteen years I've been a member here; why in the world should I have to show my card every time I walk in the door?"

Consider this scenario: You walk into your lodge's Social Quarters on a busy Friday afternoon, the door opened for you by a polite smiling younger man you don't quite recognize. Inside the lodge, the server, recognizing you – and knowing how much it irritates you – decides not to ask for your card. You request and receive a beer. Then, not wanting to offend the young man who held the door for you who is now standing next to you, the server also draws a before for him without asking for a card.

Then, at the next month's lodge meeting, this nightmare: your Administrator's trembling hand holds an invoice for more than \$90,000 in back federal income taxes, interest, penalties. and fees. The invoice has been presented to him that day by that same pleasant young man you stood next to at the bar that Friday afternoon! He was the regional IRS agent – and you had been right there when he witnessed the lodge operating as a public accommodation!

This scenario has actually happened to more than one Moose lodge. Their officers and longtime members didn't want to be "bothered" with having to show their membership cards and subsequently paid a substantial price.

Let's put the IRS and the income tax issue aside for a moment. Fraternal lodges such as our enjoy special rights as a private organization, including the right to choose who will associate with us. This does NOT mean we afford ourselves the right to discriminate on the basis of race, religion, etc. in choosing our members.

However, we lose all the rights that a private organization enjoys if we don't conduct ourselves as a private organization! We cannot have it both ways. When a lodge chooses not to check membership cards, and essentially opens itself up to the public (with the exception of approved Community Service activities), that lodge puts itself and the entire Fraternity at risk of losing its right to operate under our own rules, and losing the right to choose our own members.

Showing your card may be a slight inconvenience, but it is worth it to protect our Mooseheart kids and Moosehaven seniors entrusted to our care.


#### SHOWING YOUR MOOSE MEMEBERSHIP CARD MEANS:

### DANDILION DAZE

36<sup>th</sup> Annual Community Festival! August 25-27, 2023



By 1987, Dandilion Park (Muskego Beach Amusement Park) had long been gone. The amusement park located on the southern bank of the Muskego Lake was a great place for games, rides, music, and beach, but closed in 1977. Some of Muskego's community service group leaders thought it was time again to offer the citizens of Muskego an event and place to celebrate with family and the spirit of the community. The first weekend long family-orientated community event to be known as Muskego Community Festival was born. That was over 30 years ago!

The first festival was held on empty grounds where Pick and Save stands today. As the festival grew, there was a need for more space and the celebration moved to the grounds next to City Hall.

The family-orientated community event created in 1987 has blossomed into one of the largest free multi day festivals in southeast Wisconsin featuring music for all ages, top bands from the area, variety of food, a carnival, a corn-hole tournament, a 5K race/walk and a parade. Traditionally held the fourth weekend in August, it has often been referred to as the "official end of summer".

This is the only festival in the area which has seven collaborating community service groups that meet all year long to plan, present and staff this event.

The seven groups are: Muskego Woman's Club, Muskego Moose Family Center #1057, VFW#8171, Muskego Icetronauts Snowmobile Club, Muskego Athletic Association, Muskego Lions Club, Muskego Area Chamber of Commerce

Former groups: Little Muskego Lakes Association 1987-2022 & American Legion Post #356 1987-2020

Any excess net funds from the event are shared among the seven groups. Each group uses the funds to provide community enhancement programs in support of education, child services, city beautification, community events, patriotism as well as their own mission.

Today, as the times change, so does the festival. Muskego Community Festival will continue to offer our favorite things but will now be known as *DandiLion Daze*!

What a history of the community festival and **OUR MUSKEGO MOOSE** has been part of this since day one!

This year our Moose has been selected as the Honored Group! This means we will have a Grand Marshall in the front of the parade being driven in a snazzy car and get to choose what the theme should be for the parade.

Our Grand Marshall will be Mr. Bill Dangers! Bill has been a member of Muskego Moose Lodge 1057 since July of 2006. He Is also a Legion Member, a member of the Moose Riders and a Valued Veteran.
