Administrator Message. . .

Happy New Year!!! Hope everyone's Christmas and New Years was a good one. I'm writing this newsletter before Christmas or New Years so I can't say how mine went. 2024 looks to be a good year for the lodge. We are financially strong. Strong enough to continue making improvements to our lodge and even help other lodges with monetary donations.

Please keep Tom Kronenburg in your thoughts as he is recovering from a procedure on his brain. The procedure was performed at Froedtert Hospital on Monday December 4th. He is doing good! However, full recovery will be weeks down the road. Hopefully he will be up and back at the lodge by the time this newsletter is printed.

This past year we accomplished many improvements and upgrades at our Moose Lodge. Some are improvements and others repair and maintenance. It's quite a list!

- We got our new electronic sign and message center installed and operational. We still have to complete some landscaping around the sign.
- We replaced the kitchen door with a new, stronger door and frame.
- We repaired the kitchen floor between the walk-in cooler door and the kitchen door.
- We added more concrete around the building helping mitigate flooding of our basement.
- We repaired the cooler in the Pit Bar on the deck.
- We repaired the cooler used for tap beer in the hall kitchen.
- We replaced the old water softener with a new softener.
- We removed the old rusted steel trap doors over the exterior stair that made it very difficult to access the basement beneath the hall kitchen and built a new structure over the stairway that includes a man door. Access to the basement is now possible with great ease. The plan is to use the basement under the hall kitchen for storing important items and documents that need to be kept but access to is not frequently needed.
- We repaired a clogged drain serving the hall kitchen dishwasher and mop basin. Timing was lucky because we needed access to the basement under the hall kitchen to make the repair!

We still have many improvements and upgrades in the planning for 2024. This list I'm sure will grow as the year progresses. Here is what we have so far.

- Complete the landscaping around the new electronic sign and message center outside.
- Repair and upgrade outdoor lighting around the building including horseshoe pits.
- Install an electronic membership card access reader on the north door of the Social Quarters. It will be similar to the access reader in the main entrance vestibule. This will provide easier access to the Social Quarters for members parking in the handicap parking spots along the north side of Social Quarters.
- We have an ongoing roof leak along the party wall separating the Social Quarters and the hall. This has been a nuisance for as long as I've been involved with the Moose and several attempts to fix it eventually failed.
- Extend the outdoor deck off the hall to the east providing more deck space including two additional access points from outdoors. The single access stair on the west end of deck creates a bottle neck along the Pit Bar. A stair will be added at the east end of the deck expansion. The deck will also wrap around the hall to the east door of hall providing handicap access to the deck without having to go through the hall.

Here is the broken record again! We continue to need more help and cooperation from our membership. The more we can get membership to volunteer and help out, the better our lodge becomes. Please, if you can come out and help doing just one small thing, makes life easier for all the other volunteers. One of the important areas of our lodge needing help is in the kitchen. If you like kitchen duties, you're the person we're looking for! Please help with keeping our lodge clean and presentable. If you see trash or recyclables laying around in the building or on the ground, help out by picking it up and putting it in the trash. If you see a trash can full and are able, don't be afraid to take it out to the trash dumpsters. We have additional trash can liners. Just ask a bartender. Thinking someone else will do it is not the answer to keeping our lodge clean and enjoyable.

We continue to update our sponsors page in our newsletter and scrolling screen. If you are interested in sponsoring the Moose with your advertisement please send me the artwork and \$150. 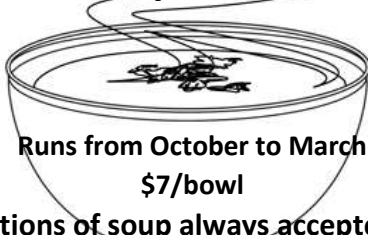

The committee's fundraiser was the Chapter Shirt Sale and raffle at the Lodge Picnic. From the proceeds the committee will be able to make a generous donation to support this important need, as well as to the WOTM Scholarship & Maintenance Fund

Nominations & Election of Officers for the Women of the Moose

The Chapter year runs from May 1st to April 30th.

We start the Election of Officer's process in January, where we ask our members to submit their names for consideration for the following offices:

Senior Regent

She shall preside at all Chapter meetings, preserve order, apply, and enforce all laws of the Women of the Moose and appoint certain officers, Chairmen of Chapter Committees, and the various special committees of the Chapter, as required by the Women of the Moose General Laws. She shall be a member of most other Chapter committees and oversee the proper operation of the Chapter. She, or the Secretary, shall sign all checks drawn by the Treasurer.

Secretary

She shall properly document the meetings of the Chapter via minutes of all meetings and preserve same as required. She shall receive all duplicate deposit slips of the Chapter, and with the Senior Regent and Treasurer, be custodian of all securities and perform all other duties required of her by the General Laws of the Women of the Moose. She, or the Senior Regent, shall sign all checks drawn by the Treasurer.

In the absence of the Senior Regent and Junior Past Regent, she presides over meetings of the Chapter.

Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for the proper collection and deposit of all Chapter funds as well as the expenditure of any funds. It is her responsibility to ensure that all membership applications and information is handled in the required manner as established by the International Office of the Women of the Moose.

Each quarter, she shall make the computer data and supporting financial information available to the Financial Review Committee for the purpose of auditing the proper documentation of all receipts and expenditures.

In the absence of the Senior Regent, Junior Past Regent and Secretary she presides over meetings of the Chapter.

Then the Nominating Committee will meet two (2) times to discuss the candidates and review their records.

At the February 15th meeting, the Slate of Officers will be announced, and the Election of Officers will take place on March 21st from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Elections of Board of Directors is just around the corner

Each year Lodges are required to hold an election of Board of Directors for the new Moose Year. (Moose Fiscal Year is May 1 – April 30). During the month of February, a Nominating Committee will be appointed by President Clyde Brophy to determine the slate of Board of Directors for the 2024-2025 year. Nominations will be accepted for the offices of President, Vice President, Chaplain, Treasurer and 3-Year Trustee. Some of the duties of these offices are:

PRESIDENT: Appoints committee chairmen, non-elected positions, presides over the Board of Directors meeting and Membership meetings, signs checks and reports in general, and is the leader of his Lodge.

VICE PRESIDENT: Serves as acting President, when necessary, attends all meetings, assist the President in preserving order and decorum in the Lodge and visits members who are ill.

CHAPLAIN: Serves on the Financial Review committee, attends all Lodge and Board of Directors meetings and presides at meeting in the absence of the President and Vice President

TREASURER: Secures duplicate deposit slips made for all Lodge bank accounts, signs all properly authorized checks and shall assist Administrator when necessary.

3-YEAR TRUSTEE: Takes inventory of Lodge merchandise for resale, examines, and approves all bills for payment, verifies books and safeguards equipment and assets of the Lodge and attends all meetings.

NOW is the time for YOU – the member – to step forward and get involved with the many things happening at YOUR Lodge. The Lodge is looking for – and needs – members with a sense of pride, commitment, and time to serve. 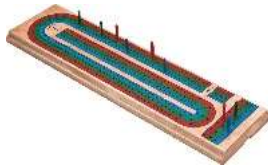

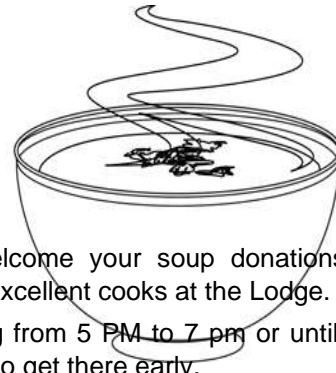
