

Administrator's Message

Hi Everyone!

I think it's safe to say summer has arrived. It's 80+ deg. outside and expected to be in the 90's next week!

Please continue to keep Tom Kronenburg in your thoughts as he is still undergoing chemo treatment for his cancer. Tom is doing good and has been in the lodge quite a bit more lately.

Our lodge is still doing well, and we are still financially strong. We are still working to make improvements. We have started work on a few projects around the lodge. Here are some of the projects we've started.

- The ongoing roof leak along the party wall separating the Social Quarters and the hall. We think we've
 determined the cause to be the roof curbs installed under the two-rooftop heating and cooling units serving
 the Social Quarters. We are working with a roofing contractor and mechanical contractor to get the curbs
 replaced.
- One of the rooftop heating and cooling units serving the Social Quarters has a failed heat exchanger. The unit
 is not able to provide heating and needs to be replaced. We have a quote from a mechanical contractor to
 replace the unit including providing new roof curbs for both this unit and the other unit serving the Social
 Quarters. This is part of addressing the roof leak issues.
- Work has begun on the landscaping around the new electronic sign and message center outside. Tracy Manz our President is spearheading the efforts with this work and we're looking for volunteers to help with this.
- Work is going to start very soon on an issue with the basement flooding we continue to experience even though we replaced the ground water sump pump in the basement. We have two sources of flooding.
 - The exterior window well is leaking water into the basement. We believe this is due to the roof gutter system being undersized causing the gutters to overflow onto the ground right next to the basement window well. Our solution is to increase drainage capacity of the gutters by adding additional downspouts to the gutters.
 - O Water continues to spill over the basement floor slab at the bottom landing of the stairs down to the basement. We believe this is due to a clogged drain tile at the footing of the foundation wall. We have a contractor scheduled to come out and cut a hole in the basement floor to expose the drain tile and rod out the blockage in the drain tile. Hopefully, this is the solution. Because if it is not, we're back to square one as to determining the cause.

The following projects have been put on the back burner due to the expected costs of replacing the rooftop heating and cooling units, repairing the roof leaks and solving the basement flooding issues.

- Improving the exterior lighting around the building. We still believe we can get this worked on very soon.
- New carpet in the hall. Not sure at this time when this will be completed.
- Expansion of the exterior deck on the south side of the banquet hall. Not sure when this project will be completed.
- Install an electronic membership card access reader on the north door of the Social Quarters. Not sure when this work will be completed.

If you see a trash can full and are able, don't be afraid to take it out to the trash dumpsters. We have additional trash can liners. Just ask a bartender. Thinking someone else will do it is not the answer to keeping our lodge clean and enjoyable.

MOOSE GUEST POLICY

Only the following person may be admitted as a "qualified guest" into the social quarters or home of any lodge of the Order.

- A. An active lodge or chapter member's spouse (Note There are no limits on the number of times a spouse may be admitted as a guest.)
- B. An active lodge or chapter member's immediate family (Note there are no limits on the number of times a spouse or qualified family member under the age of 21 may be admitted as a guest, however, all other immediate family members would be limited to two visits as they now qualify as a prospective member of the person signing them into the social quarters.)
- C. A prospective member is defined as any guest that is accompanied by a member who can sponsor them for membership in the Order, with the exception listed in (A) of this section. As permitted by the House Committee, a prospective member may be admitted subject to the following.
 - a. The prospective member is accompanied at all times by his or her sponsor.
 - b. The prospective member is properly signed in as a guest.
 - c. The prospective member shall not make purchases.
 - d. The prospective member shall leave when his or her sponsor leaves.
 - e. The prospective member shall be limited to two (2) visits.

All adult guests of members must be signed in as a guest and leave when the member leaves.

The committee's fundraising project is the raffles at the family picnic. This year, the Fraternal Activities Committee is extremely pleased to be able to donate funds towards the Mooseheart Girls Athletic Program as well as the WOTM Scholarship & Maintenance Fund.




