Administrator's Message

I think we all would agree with me on where did the summer go? It's already the beginning of September!

Good news on Tom Kronenburg! His Chemotherapy is ending this month. Doc says he's looking really good and no longer needs to continue although he was scheduled to do so through the end of this year. I hope we all will see Tom in the lodge more as he starts feeling better from the effects of chemo over the next few weeks/months.

Our lodge is still financially strong. We are still working to make improvements. We have started work on a few projects around the lodge. Here are some of the projects we've started including updates on status.

- The ongoing roof leak along the party wall separating the Social Quarters and the hall. We've determined the cause to be the roof curbs installed under the rooftop heating and cooling units serving the Social Quarters. We are working with a roofing contractor and mechanical contractor to get the curbs replaced. This is taking longer than I had hoped but we're making progress as I just submitted for a grant from Moose International to help pay for this work.
- Work has begun on the landscaping around the new electronic sign and message center outside. Tracy Manz our President is spearheading the efforts with this work and she is still looking for volunteers to help with this.
- Work is hopefully going to start very soon on the issues with the basement flooding This also has taken longer than I had hoped.
- Improving the exterior lighting around the building. We have a quote from a contractor and are looking at determining what portion of this work can be done in house before we proceed with using the contractor we have the quote from. We hope we can get this worked on very soon.

The following projects are still on the back burner until replacing the rooftop heating and cooling units, repairing the roof leaks and solving the basement flooding issues are completed. We are not sure at this time when the projects below will be completed.

- New carpet in the hall.
- Expansion of the exterior deck on the south side of the banquet hall.
- Install an electronic membership card access reader on the north door of the Social Quarters.

Here is the never ending broken record!

• We continue to need more help and cooperation from our membership. The more we can get membership to volunteer and help out, the better our lodge becomes. The board is still working on developing a list of tasks/chores to be taken care of that don't get the regular attention needed. These should be rather easy things most any member could step up and do. Will keep you posted on when this list becomes available. If everyone could come out and helps doing just one small thing, it would make life easier for all the other volunteers. One of the important areas of our lodge needing help is in the kitchen. Thanks to a few people who stepped up, we have been able to continue our Wednesday grilling out on the deck. If you like kitchen duties, you're the person we're looking for. Please contact myself or Doug S. if you would like to help in the kitchen.

HALL RENTAL COORDINATOR WANTED


Here is what is involved with renting the hall. If interested please contact Kevin Pope, Administrator or Tracy Manz, President.

- Responds to requests for information by phone, text, email and in person.
- Meet with potential clients to show hall and explain what we offer, capacity etc.
- Execute contracts with clients and file copy with Administrator, and one for your records.
- Secure Certificate of Insurance (COI) from caterer if event is being catered.
- Communicate with Bar Manager on any bar/beer orders and special requests for delivery for events and to make sure someone will be onsite to let the party in to set up/decorate prior to the event.
- Communicate with Doug Knight on any sign info they would like posted.
- Input Contract Hall Rental Information into electronic calendar, updating information as date gets closer and emailing info to the Administrator and bartender a week prior to the event.
- Communicate with Special Moose Events Chairpersons to ensure the future dates are on the calendar before booking private events. (Example: Holiday Parties, tractor pulls, Junk-in-the-Trunk, annual car show & sports tournaments, etc)

MEMBERSHIP!!!!! Chapter Members: As of May 1, 2021, all chapter members became members of the lodge in addition to still being a chapter member. So, to be a member in good standing, the chapter members are required to pay the lodge dues which are \$55.00 per year.
