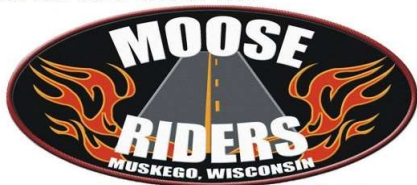

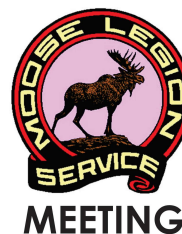
Funeral lunches will no longer be provided by the lodge. Members may arrange for food to be brought into the lodge.

Administrator's Message

Greetings! It's safe to say fall is here with winter not far behind.

Good news on Tom Kronenburg! He's baaaakkk! Tom's chemotherapy is over, and he appears to be getting healthy again. Also, Tom has offered to become the Assistant Administrator! Welcome relief for yours truly!

Our lodge is still financially strong. We are still working to make improvements. We have started work on a few projects around the lodge. Here are some of the projects we've started including updates on status.

- If you have been to the lodge lately, you should have noticed the horseshoe pit yard all torn up. Currently work is almost half complete with regrading of yard, new concrete runs and seeding for new grass. This is quite an undertaking mostly donated by Ken Whitehouse and his group of friends including many horseshoe folks! The plan is to be complete with work before the start of Monday and Tuesday horseshoe leagues next spring. This is expected to provide world class horseshoe pits just in time for the Wisconsin Moose Association Horseshoe Tournament we are hosting August next summer.
- The ongoing roof leak along the party wall separating the Social Quarters & hall and rooftop HVAC unit replacement is expected to be complete before end of year. We were awarded a \$5000 grant from Moose International to help pay for the new rooftop unit!
- Work has slowed down on the landscaping around the new electronic sign and message center outside. Tracy Manz our President is spearheading the efforts with this work, and she is still looking for volunteers to help with this.
- Some work has started on correcting issues with the basement flooding Two additional downspouts on the roof gutter at the southwest corner of the main kitchen. The expectation is this will eliminate overflowing of the gutter that has been a main cause of basement flooding.
- Improving the exterior lighting around the building. We have a contractor that was scheduled to perform the improvements a week or so ago. However, the City of Muskego is refusing to issue the contractor a permit for performing the work due to a discrepancy as to whether some of the existing lighting on the grounds was ever originally approved. It is my understanding the existing lighting in question are the lights serving the horseshoe yard and driveway entrance. The city is saying this lighting was never approved. In talking with some of our longtime members who were around when we had the old farmhouse as our lodge, this lighting has been there since the early 70's and also was grandfathered in when we built the hall in 2007. I'm questioning if there was a permit process in place back then when the lighting was installed? Anyways, I'm working with the city to see how we can get past this issue. Hopefully we're able to resolve the issue.
- Installation of an electronic membership card access reader on the north door of the Social Quarters is scheduled to be performed along with the lighting improvements. I guess when we get our permit, this will get installed.

The following projects are still on the back burner until replacing the rooftop heating and cooling units, repairing the roof leaks and solving the basement flooding issues are completed.

- New carpet in the hall. Not sure at this time when this will be completed.
- Expansion of the exterior deck on the south side of the banquet hall. Not sure when this project will be completed.

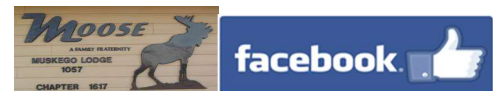
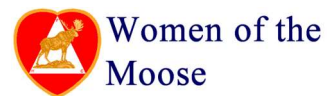
Here is what is involved with renting the hall. If interested please contact Kevin Pope, Administrator or Tracy Manz, President.

- Input Contract Hall Rental Information into electronic calendar, updating information as date gets closer and emailing info to the Administrator and bartender a week prior to the event.
- Communicate with Special Moose Events Chairpersons to ensure the future dates are on the calendar before booking private events. (Example: Holiday Parties, tractor pulls, Junk-in-the-Trunk, annual car show & sports tournaments, etc)

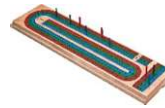

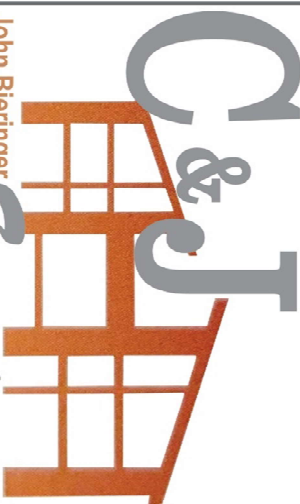

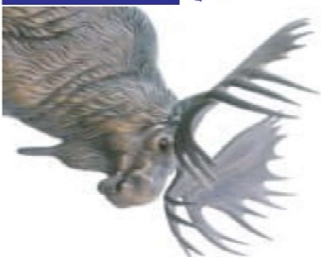
