

Administrator's Message

Hi Everyone!

Greetings! I Think we would all agree that winter is here. Ugh! Too cold out. If you're anything like me, I totally understand not liking it cold out. The older I get, the less tolerant I've become with cold weather! Hopefully, it will be a short winter!

Our lodge continues to be financially strong. We continue to make improvements. We have completed a few projects around the lodge lately. Here are some of the projects we've completed and others in the planning including updates on status.

- Looks like upgrades to the horseshoe pits has been put on hold due to the winter weather. They're about 2/3 complete with the work and should resume work to complete early spring.
- The ongoing roof leak we hope has been finally repaired with repairs to the roof around the installation of our new rooftop HVAC unit serving the Social Quarters. Spring rains will let us know if we've succeeded.
- The new rooftop HVAC unit replacement serving the Social Quarters is complete and working as expected. We
 are in the process of upgrading the thermostats serving the two rooftop units serving the Social Quarters with
 new wireless thermostats. This will allow us to locate the thermostats more efficiently for better temperature
 control.
- Work has come to a screeching halt on the landscaping around the new electronic sign and message center outside. Tracy is hoping to resume this work in the spring.
- Two additional downspouts on the roof gutter at the southwest corner of the main kitchen has been installed and appears to be solving our basement flooding problem. Spring rains will let us know if we've succeeded.
- Improvement to the exterior lighting around the building (specifically parking lots) have been made and are complete. We were able to work through the permitting challenges with the city. They made us install lighting a little different than desired. But appears to still have improved lighting to satisfactory levels.
- Installation of an electronic membership card access reader on the north door of the Social Quarters has been installed and is complete. Members have experienced some difficulty in using the card reader. This card reader is a different manufacturer than the existing card reader in the main entrance and takes a little getting used to. It does work with a little education to members on how to use it. I've explained the proper way to use it to bartenders so they can assist members as needed and I've explained this in membership meetings. Look for my explanation in this newsletter.

The following projects are next in line for continued improvements to our lodge.

- New carpet in the hall. This is our next project. We are in the process of acquiring bids from a couple carpet companies and hope to have new carpet by spring.
- Expansion of the exterior deck on the south side of the banquet hall. Still not sure when this project will be completed. Hopefully after the carpet is complete baring no major issues arise this winter or spring.

Here is the never-ending broken record!

• We continue to need more help and cooperation from our membership. The more we can get membership to volunteer and help, the better our lodge becomes. The board continues to work on a list of tasks/chores to be taken care of that don't get the regular attention needed. A small white board in our entrance lobby lists a few things we need help with. These should be rather easy things most any member could step up and do. We will continue to update this list of volunteer opportunities.

- If everyone could come out and help doing just one small thing, it would make life easier for all the other volunteers. One of the important areas of our lodge always needing help is in the kitchen. Thanks to a few people who stepped up, we have been able to continue our Wednesday wings, Thursday Taco night and two Friday fish fry's a month.
- Please help us with keeping our lodge clean and presentable. If you see trash or recyclables laying around in
 the building or ESPECIALLY on the grounds, help by picking it up and putting it in the trash. If you see a trash

 Just ask a bartender. Thinking someone else will do it is not the answer to keeping our lodge clean and
 enjoyable.

A number of our children at Mooseheart require short and long-term treatment in the areas of Physical and Occupational Therapy. Whether children arrive at Mooseheart requiring a continuation of services, receive a referral by our pediatrician or are recovering from an injury, these medical treatments are often not covered by the state's children's health care plan or, a provider within the plan is too far away from Mooseheart. To ensure that our kids receive quality medical care our support in this area is truly important!

The committee's fundraiser was the Junk-in-the-Trunk event held in June. From the proceeds the committee will be able to make a generous donation to support this important need, as well as to the WOTM Scholarship & Maintenance Fund

Mooseheart/Moosehaven Committee Honored at February meeting

The annual pharmacy budget for our Moosehaven resident's averages \$300,000 per year, over and above the amounts covered by Medicare and private insurance. 




