



With sadness it is shared long time Muskego Moose member, Mr. Wayne Franzen, passed away on October 13, 2025.

Wayne joined the Muskego Moose Lodge in 1976, making him a 50-year member. He held the offices of Lodge Trustee in 1995 and Junior Past Governor in 2003. Wayne was also a member of Moose Legion 31, holding every office. He joined the Ritual Team for many years. The Ritual Team not only enrolled new members but competed against other Moose teams in the state. For anyone that enjoys horseshoes at the lodge, you have Wayne to thank for that--he built the original horseshoe pits along with Tom Steinke! He continued playing the sport he enjoyed until recent times. He started the Muskego open horseshoe tournament that is still going on today. In addition to horseshoes, you could find Wayne bowling in Moose State Bowling tournaments and playing dart ball.

When Wayne wasn't mowing the lodge grounds, he was part of a team of men and women who presented the steak fry events! To this day they are legendary!

Wayne enrolled ten members. Being a Moose became a family affair with his wife, Joyce, joining the Chapter, and his son, Scott, joining the lodge and eventually becoming lodge governor himself (more than once).

Wayne's 50-year membership never wavered --he had joined when the lodge was just a small house on the corner of Janesville and Racine, he stayed active with leadership roles, horseshoes, darts, bowling, volunteering, even when the old house was torn down. When the new lodge was built, he continued to enjoy his membership and also supported Mooseheart and Moosehaven, up until the time of his passing. Wayne, you will be missed.


